





Information:

- Animals should always wear identification tags with name and phone number and have a microchip implanted.
- Have a current photograph of your pet, so it can be identified.
- Have your veterinarian's phone number next to the telephone, as well as the number of 24 hour emergency care.
- Know where emergency care is located.
- The number for poison control could be useful.

Supplies:

- Keep a two week supply of canned or dry food with your emergency supplies. Rotate supply for freshness.
- Include water for 7-14 days (dogs 1 gal/day, cats 1 quart/day).
- Include pet's medications.
- Have a carrier for small dogs and cats with a blanket or sweater from owner & favorite toy.
- Have a leash for every pet.
- Keep gauze to use as bandages and muzzle since an injured animal may bite the owner.
- Have hydrogen peroxide to clean wounds, a tube of antibiotic ointment, and a thermometer.
- Other items to have: towels, blankets, manual can opener, kitty litter pans, plastic bags, water dishes.

Other:

- Arrange for a friend or relative who can keep your pet if necessary.
- Take a pet first aid course.
